Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand commentary in response to the Recommendations of the Senate Economic References Committee report Cooperative, Mutual and Member-owned Firms

Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (Chartered Accountants ANZ) welcomes consultation on the recommendations of the Senate Economic References Committee report *Cooperative, Mutual and Member-owned Firms* to assist in developing a Government response to deliver meaningful reform in the Co-operative Mutual Enterprises (CME) sector.

Our comments in this submission are limited specifically to Recommendation 9 of the Senate report which states:

The Committee recommends that professional accreditation bodies, such as the Law Society and Institute of Chartered Accountants, require a demonstrated knowledge of the co-operatives and mutual structure before it will license its members to practice accounting or law.

A fundamental element of being a Chartered Accountant (CA) is completing robust professional qualifications together with undertaking continuing professional education. Chartered Accountants ANZ (formerly known as the Institute of Chartered Accountants Australia) provides the core education and ongoing learning to enable members to bring the necessary knowledge and skills to their work.

The CA qualification is designed to meet stringent requirements of external and internal bodies, including:

- 1. Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency Act 2011
- 2. Higher Education Standards Framework (Threshold Standards) 2011
- 3. Global Accounting Alliance (GAA reciprocal membership agreements
- 4. International Federation of Accountants (IFAC) International Accounting Education Standards

The qualification program is overseen and managed by an Education Board and Member Advisory Panels, which include members who represent the Not-for-Profit and Small to Medium Enterprises communities.

Our regulations set out the continuing professional development (CPD) requirements for individual members of Chartered Accountants ANZ. These require members to develop and maintain the professional competence necessary to provide high quality services to clients, employers, and other stakeholders, and to strengthen public trust in the profession. Learning and training opportunities include a number of courses specifically relating to NFPs such as Not-For-Profit Regulatory Compliance and Not-for-Profit Officers, Directors & the Board.
