I understand that there is an intention to restrict the advocacy aspects of the work of organisations which have the advantage of tax deductibility in relation to the environment.

I fully understand that the Prime Minister who is an advocate for the environment has quite a deal of opposition within his party and it may well be that the noise of climate change

advocates makes it difficult within the party.

As the majority of Australians are concerned about climate change not just for themselves but particularly their children, there is a substantial need for advocacy and leadership in

the community at a time when efforts from government are falling behind reasonable expectations.
