## RE: Reforming Flood Insurance: A proposal to improve availability and transparency

I write in response to Treasury's consultation paper Reforming Flood Insurance: A Proposal to Improve Availability and Transparency ('the consultation paper').

The Consumer Action Law Centre has prepared a Joint Consumer submission ('Joint Consumer submission') in response dated 3 April 2012.<sup>1</sup>

I write to support the Joint Consumer submission as prepared by Consumer Action Law Centre, including the support within that submission for the National Disaster Insurance Review ('NDIR') Panel's key finding on the need for mandatory flood cover in all home and contents policies.

I do not support the model proposed in the consultation paper - that insurers would be required to offer flood cover in home building and home contents insurance policies and that insurers can allow consumers to 'opt out' from flood cover ('the opt out model'). As outlined in the Joint Consumer submission, the opt out model will simply not address the key aim of NDIR review, being to ensure the availability of flood cover for those most at risk of flood.

By way of background, Legal Aid NSW has been involved in various consultations regarding NDIR, including stakeholder engagement with the NDIR Panel in 2011. Legal Aid NSW was also part of consumers consultations leading up to the development of the report entitled NDIR – A Consumer Perspective on NDIR Issues Paper, as well as with consumer representatives preparing and contributing to the Joint Consumer submission we are currently endorsing.
