USER GUIDE

The purpose of the 2011-12 Portfolio Supplementary Additional Estimates Statements (PSAES) is to inform Senators, Members of Parliament and the public of the proposed allocation of additional resources to Government outcomes by agencies within the portfolio.

The PSAES facilitate understanding of the proposed appropriations in Appropriation Bill (No. 5) 2011-12 and Appropriation Bill (No. 6) 2011-12. In this sense the PSAES is declared by the Appropriation Acts to be a 'relevant document' to the interpretation of the Acts according to section 15AB of the *Acts Interpretation Act 1901*.

Appropriation Bill (No. 5), which follows on from Appropriation Bill (No. 1) tabled at Budget and Appropriation Bill (No. 3) tabled at Additional Estimates, will provide additional expenditure authority for the ordinary annual services of government in respect of the 2011-12 financial year. Appropriation Bill (No. 6), which follows on from Appropriation Bill (No. 2) tabled at Budget and Appropriation Bill (No. 4) tabled at Additional Estimates, will provide additional expenditure authority in respect of the 2011-12 financial year for capital works and services, payments to or for the States, Territories and local government authorities, and new administered outcomes not authorised by specific legislation.

AUSTRALIAN TAXATION OFFICE

Overview of additional appropriations

The Australian Taxation Office (ATO) is seeking an additional \$7.4 million in Appropriation Bill (No.5) 2011-12 for the stronger super – self managed superannuation funds auditor registration measure (\$4.5 million) and the personal income tax – better targeting of the employment termination payment tax offset measure (\$2.9 million).

The ATO is also seeking an additional \$1.5 million in Appropriation Bill (No.6) 2011-12 for the stronger super – self managed superannuation funds auditor registration measure.

Details of the stronger super – self managed superannuation funds auditor registration and personal income tax – better targeting of the employment termination payment tax offset measures are in Budget Paper No. 2, *Budget Measures 2012-13*.
