## **Consultation on Treasury Laws Amendment (Gift Cards) Regulations 2018**

The Consumers' Federation of Australia (**CFA**) is the peak body for consumer organisations in Australia. CFA represents a diverse range of consumer organisations, including most major national consumer organisations.

We advocate in the interests of Australian consumers with and through our members, support consumer representatives to industry and government processes, develop policy on important consumer issues and facilitates consumer participation in the development of Australian and international standards for goods and services.

We are also a full member of Consumers International, the international peak body for the world's consumer organisations.

CFA strongly supports the submission made by a member organisation, the Queensland Consumers Association.

CFA is particularly concerned about 89B of the draft Regulations which would allow post—supply fees and charges for disputing a transaction.

For the reasons given in the Association's submission, CFA considers it extremely important; to **not** allow in the Regulation for gift card issuers to charge consumers post-supply fees or charges for disputing transactions.

To allow this would be contrary to the basic principle in international and Australian dispute resolution standards, which is very widely adopted in Australia, that access to complaints handing processes should be free of charge to the complainant.
