Statutory Review of the Meetings and Documents Amendments

Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CA ANZ) welcomes the opportunity to provide feedback to the Statutory Review. Our experience, and that of our members, indicates that the amendments relating to the conduct of company and registered scheme meetings have proven successful. More information about CA ANZ can be found at Appendix A.

Importantly, the amendments allow broad, equal participation by our members in company meetings irrespective of their geographical location. Equally, our members who convene meetings, such as registered liquidators, value the option for participants to attend meetings virtually, rather than travel, often significant, distances to attend a short meeting. In the same way, the ability to sign documents by electronic means has removed significant barriers to timely completion of critical documents.

Likewise, the flexibility to choose to provide electronic or hard copies of documents relevant to a meeting can streamline the provision of documents. While we support a digital-first approach, we acknowledge the importance of an individual's right to elect how they receive documents, and that the sender must take reasonable steps to comply. This ensures those with minimal technology literacy are treated equally with those that utilise technology day-to-day. We have not received any feedback that indicates such elections are not being met.

The adoption of these amendments indicates the readiness of entities in Australia to embrace the benefits offered by technology and the effectiveness of doing so. Accordingly, we reiterate our call for government departments and agencies to identify any remaining statutory documents that still require wet signatures and consider how they can be converted to a digital form.

For example, the Australian Securities and Investments Commission Form RA01 Notification to register, change details of or cease as an agent. This must be downloaded and printed, completed and signed, and filed by the agent. ASIC only require a digital copy of the signed form. We suggest this is better managed by electronic lodgement followed by an electronic notice to effected parties of the change.

We strongly support the meetings and documents amendments and consider they have modernised statutory meetings and document execution by harnessing the benefits of technological change. We anticipate that the success of these amendments, as indicated by the statistics provided in the consultation paper, will also advance more businesses modernising their constitutions to benefit from these amendments.
